AFSCME members and staff enrolled in the National Labor College Bachelor’s degree may be eligible for a *Nadra Floyd Memorial Scholarship* worth up to \$2,000 per year. Full-time AFSCME local, council or international staff members and local union officers with substantial organizing responsibilities may qualify for a *Joey Parisi Memorial Scholarship*.
